GSP financial sustainability Joshua French, Chief Executive, GSP	<ul> <li>Greater Sydney Parklands (GSP) provided an overview of the financial arrangements for the parklands and specifically for Western Sydney Parklands. The focus of the GSPT Board and GSP is to ensure the parks are funded, conserved, maintained and activated for the benefit of the public.</li> <li>Western Sydney Parklands (WSP) is sustainably funded for the next 100 years through its</li> </ul>
	ability to generate its own income via long terms leases for business hubs. All revenue generated from the business hub leases goes back into WSP.
	GSP provided an overview of the upcoming review of the <i>Greater Sydney Parklands Trust Act 2022</i> , required 2 years from the commencement of the Act. This may include an opportunity for the CTB and other stakeholders to provide feedback.

	A CTB member presented information regarding wildlife corridors and suggested developing a wildlife improvement plan. CTB members were concerned about the number of injured or deceased wildlife within and around Western Sydney Parklands.
Correspondence and questions	The CTB hopes to see Western Sydney Parklands balancing protection of the environment with commercial ventures to help protect the local wildlife.
